

# PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The Parish Council met on 21 st November 2024 in Brockley Village Hall. Present were:
Cllr. Steve Holmes, Cllr. Ray Dinsey, Cllr. Barry Tyler, Cllr. Sue Hudson, Cllr. Felicity Driver, Cllr. Geoffrey Baber and Cllr. Dr. Julie Wymer (Chair).
The meeting on the 21st is the time when councillor's consider the budget and precept for the following year and high on the agenda was the funding for the children's Playground.

## CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND

I am very pleased to be able to report that the Parish Council is now in receipt of 75% of the £20,000 required for the new play equipment. An extremely generous donation of £10,000 was made by the Brockley Charitable Trust and together with £5,000 from parish council funds we are left with a £5,000 deficit. An application for £5,000 has been made to West Suffolk Council and we hope to hear if we have been successful by Christmas.

The playground will be slightly reduced in size for two reasons:

1. The most expensive part of the playground is the surface and by cutting down the current footprint we can make the project more affordable, and

2. the trees that border the playground contribute to the deterioration of the play equipment and by moving part of the playground forward, from under the trees, we can try and avoid the algae, moss and bird poop from dropping all over the equipment. However, the extremely

large poplar tree is sending up suckers into the playground area and we are in the process of getting the tree removed with a view to planting a small ornamental tree

#### which shouldn't give us the same problems.

The fence around the playground is to be repurposed for the time being as funds do not allow us to replace it. However, we will continue to seek further funding so we can replace the fence with a metal one and provide a children's picnic bench.

#### **COMMUNITY CONSULTATION**

38 residents completed the questionnaire either on-line or a paper copy providing us with a 12.14% completion rate which is not a bad result given the population of Brockley is 313. Evaluation of the findings confirm that 92% of respondents have used the playground in the past by parents/grandparents and 73% agree that a new playground will improve the look of the surrounding area.

I wish to place on record my thanks and appreciation to the trustees of the Charitable Trust for their generous donation; to Gillian Leader for her brilliant work in writing a funding application for us to submit to West Suffolk Council and to village residents for supporting the playground project by completing the questionnaire – I am sure the new playground will be a great asset to the village and provide a lovely environment for children to play and learn for generations to come. Picnic Benches

Two new picnic benches have been put together and are now in place beside the village hall. The heritage benches on the green have been lovingly restored by Sue Tyler and our thanks and appreciation go to her for improving the benches which you can now sit on! Enjoy.

#### PRECEPT/ BUDGET

Until the outcome of our bid to West Suffolk Council is known it is not possible to decide what the 2025/26 precept should be. Councillor's took the decision to defer setting the precept until the January 2025 meeting by which time we will have the financial facts in front of us.

If funding allows, we have several other projects we would like to progress.

#### TRAFFIC CALMING

Parish councillors met recently with County Councillor Bobby Bennett and Suffolk Highways to understand what measures we can consider in reducing the speed of traffic along Mill Road. We do have the option of carrying out a speed survey and putting a Speed Indicator Device somewhere along the road.

# **BIODIVERSITY**

To continue the good work which is going into rewilding the pond and surrounding area we hope to purchase some pond sedge plants and supplement the hedging whips if needed.

# <u>VE DAY</u>

May 5 th 2025 will be the 80 th celebration of VE Day and hopefully our trusty project team will be able to meet in January and come up with a plan.

# VILLAGE HALL UPDATES

# HALL HIRE INFORMATION

The Trustees have changed the evening hire times so that the latest the Hall can be hired is now 11 pm and all music must finish by this time. Originally it was midnight but this change has been made as a consideration to residents.

# **TV LICENCE**

The Village Hall no longer has a TV licence as TV programmes are hardly ever shown in the Hall. However, we have recently learned that we also have to have an additional MPCL licence to cover copyright in the programmes, which would cost us almost an additional £400. This is a recent ruling that many Village Halls are only just finding out about and seems very unfair and appears to apply to business premises including Charities.

The Trustees are always trying to ensure that the Hall is run on a solid financial footing so we didn't feel £559 for the two licences, just to be able occasionally to show a TV programme, was good value.

#### WINTER SUPPORT FUND

West Suffolk Council have again invited us to apply for their Winter Support Fund, a fund to support local people through the winter by providing a warm space for the Community to meet and provide hot drinks and food where possible. We were successful with our application and have been awarded £1400 to be used for the specific uses described above.

The Village Hall Trustees are pleased to be able to offer free hall hire to all regular clubs forJanuary, February and March and to support the Carols Round the Tree in December by coveringthe cost of the Hall hire and the food and drink. Please note this is for Community events anddoes not cover non-resident bookings, private parties or events that are raising money.In addition to the above support the Trustees have already agreed to buy the Village ChristmasTree this year from Hall funds, many thanks to Andrew English who is organising this.

#### PENSION CREDIT

The Council have asked us to advertise the availability of Pension Credit as an estimated 800,000 people are eligible for it but not receiving it. ARE YOU ONE OF THOSE PEOPLE?
With the withdrawal of the Winter Fuel Payment only people on Pension Credit will get the one-off Winter Fuel Payment this year. Getting Pension Credit opens the door to additional benefits such as help with the cost of dental work, glasses and transport to hospital; help with rent or mortgage interest; and help paying Council Tax. Not to mention a free TV licence for those aged 75 and over.

A lot of people think if they have savings they won't be entitled, but that is not always the case. The Council encourages you to check if you are eligible by using the contact information on the poster in this newsletter.

#### What about people who are not entitled to Pension Credit?

There is additional support throughout West Suffolk available to Communities who may find themselves vulnerable this winter. The Government Funded Household Support Fund has been extended to March 2025 and is an allocation of funding given to Suffolk County Council to support people who are experiencing hardship or struggling with rising costs. Suffolk County Council allocates Household Support Fund money to residents in a number of ways including Local Welfare Assistance Scheme, help with food, heating, clothing, fuel and white goods, Warm Homes Suffolk, help to insulate properties, Other Benefits, Support with housing benefits, mortgage interest, Council Tax reduction, Carers allowance,

Discretionary Payments, housing payments and exceptional hardship payments. Suffolk Oil Loans. So there are lots of possible ways people could be helped and worth looking into. Contact your local Council for advice.



Ideally we will be outdoors experiencing the nature around us but we will usually be able to access the hall to avoid cancellation in poor weather



# SUCCESS AFTER STROKE


